Parental Controls

- ▶ A Premium Feature of McAfee Internet Security Suite & McAfee Total Protection
- ▶ How to Set it Up

Setting the User Content Rating Group

- ▶ You need to identify the user you want to set the parental controls on.
- ▶ Click on the “Advanced” button.



Switch the User Account Type from Windows to McAfee



► “To create and configure new McAfee User Accounts, click **Switch**. Creating McAfee User Accounts makes it unnecessary to create Windows User Accounts.”

Manage Users – Set Up Administrator Password

- ▶ Pick a good password or risk losing control of these parental controls.

Set up the Administrator password to start managing McAfee users for the first time.

- ▶ Enter their name, password, and assign a "Limited" account.

As the Administrator, you can specify which types of content users can view by changing user permissions and options.

To create a standard user account type, click **Limited**, and then click **Create**.

Limited (recommended) Administrator

Note: Options for Limited users must be configured under Parental Controls. McAfee recommends that you configure these options immediately after creating a new user account.

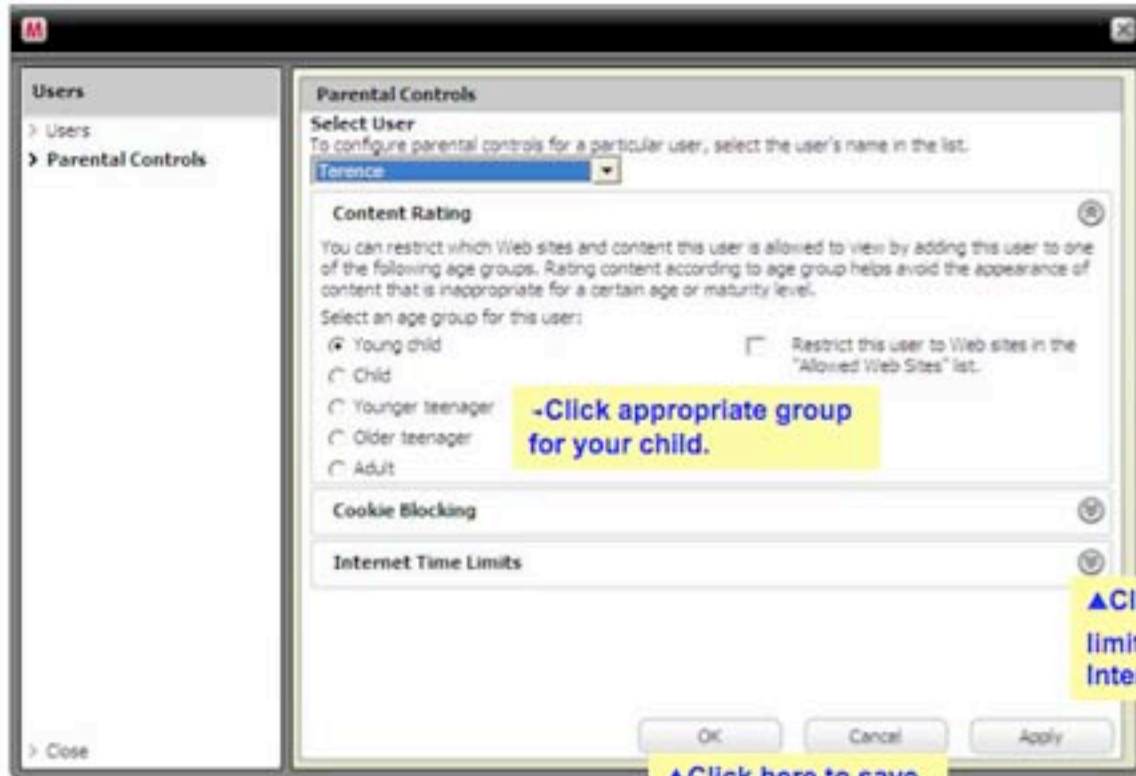

Assign a Content Rating to Your Child

- ▶ After entering all your children's names, assign content ratings based upon their ages. Content ratings are based on key words assessments.

Configuring Parental Controls in the SecurityCenter

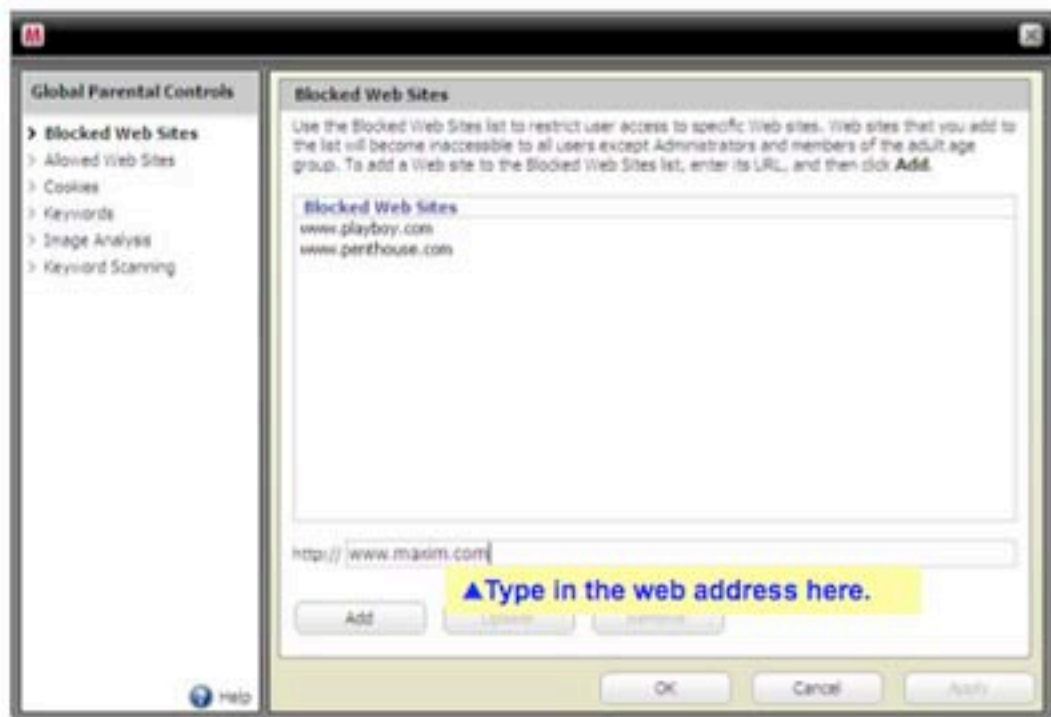
- ▶ Next to the Parental Controls option click on the Configure button.

- ▶ Type in the web site's address (URL) and click "Add"

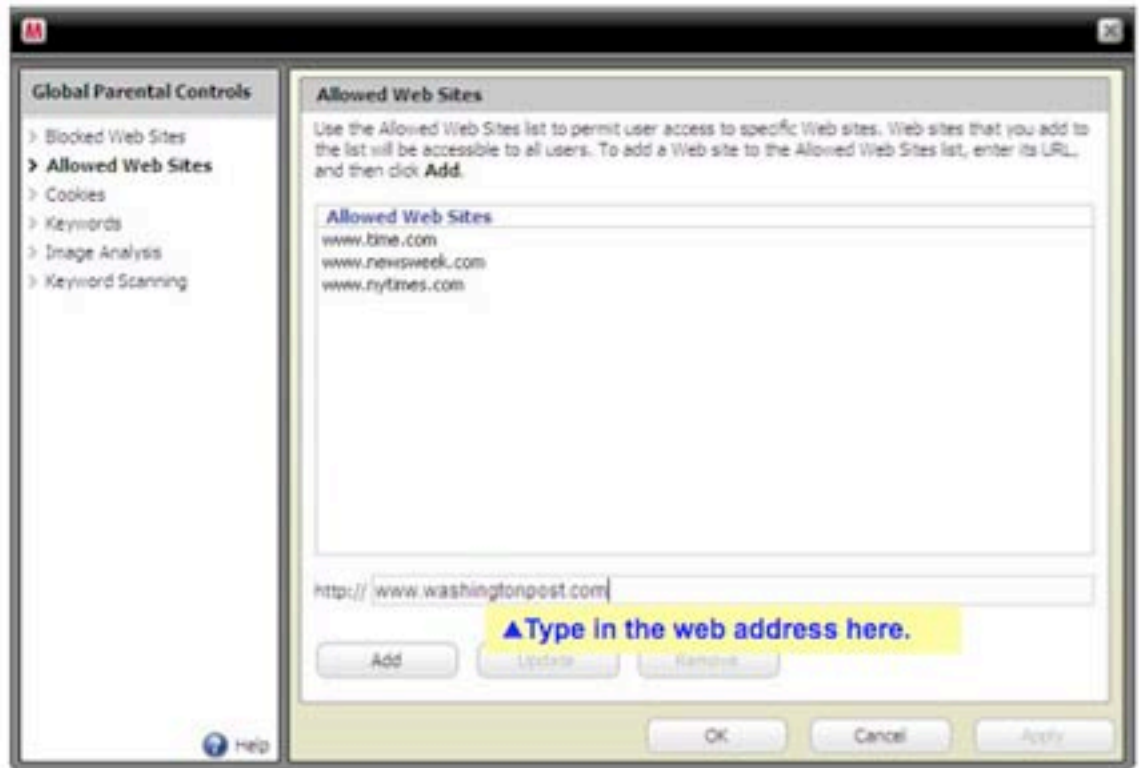
Keywords



► McAfee maintains a list of keywords that determines what sites children can visit.

Allowed Web Sites

- ▶ You can prevent a child from surfing any web site not on the allowed list.

- Some sites don't work properly if you don't allow cookies. You can add these web sites here.

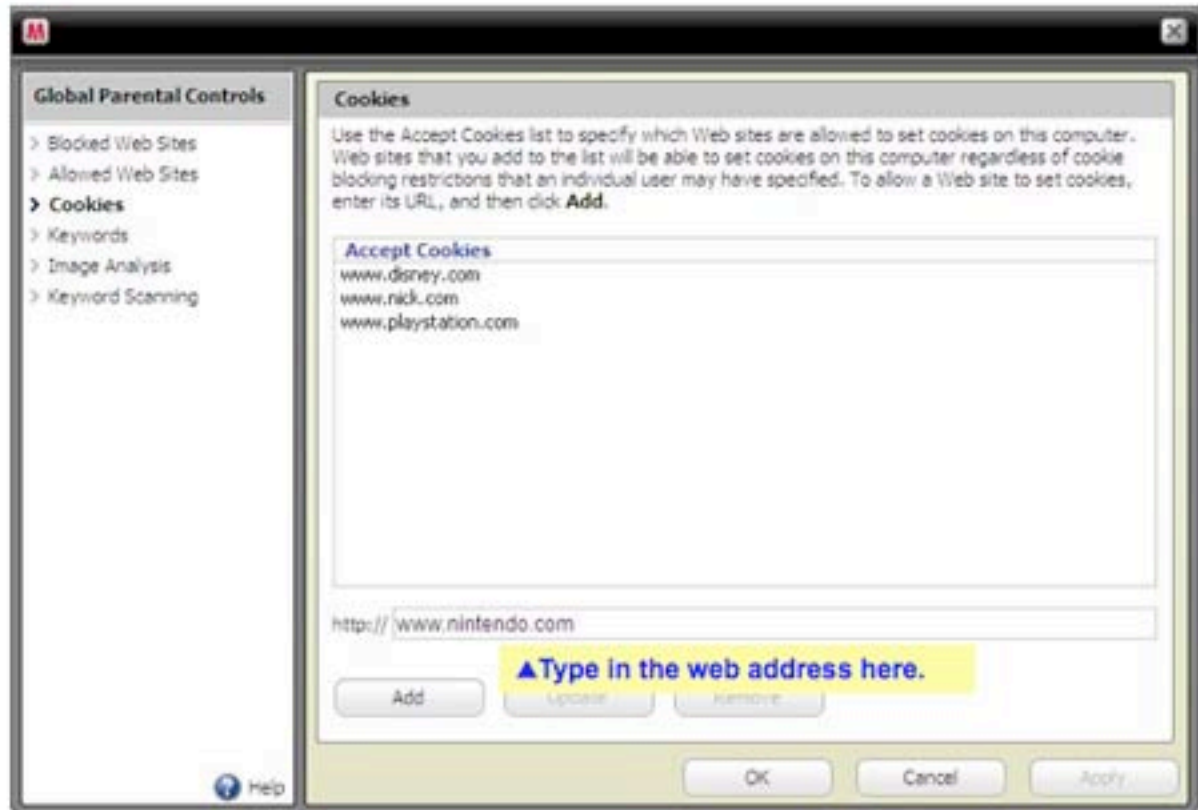
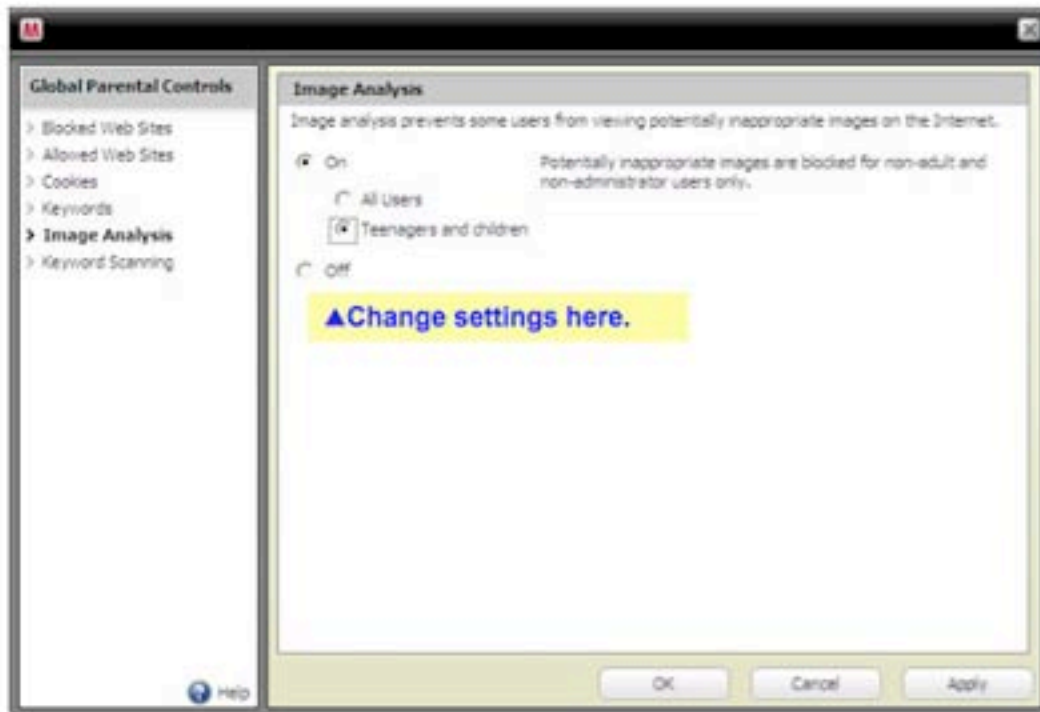


Image Analysis

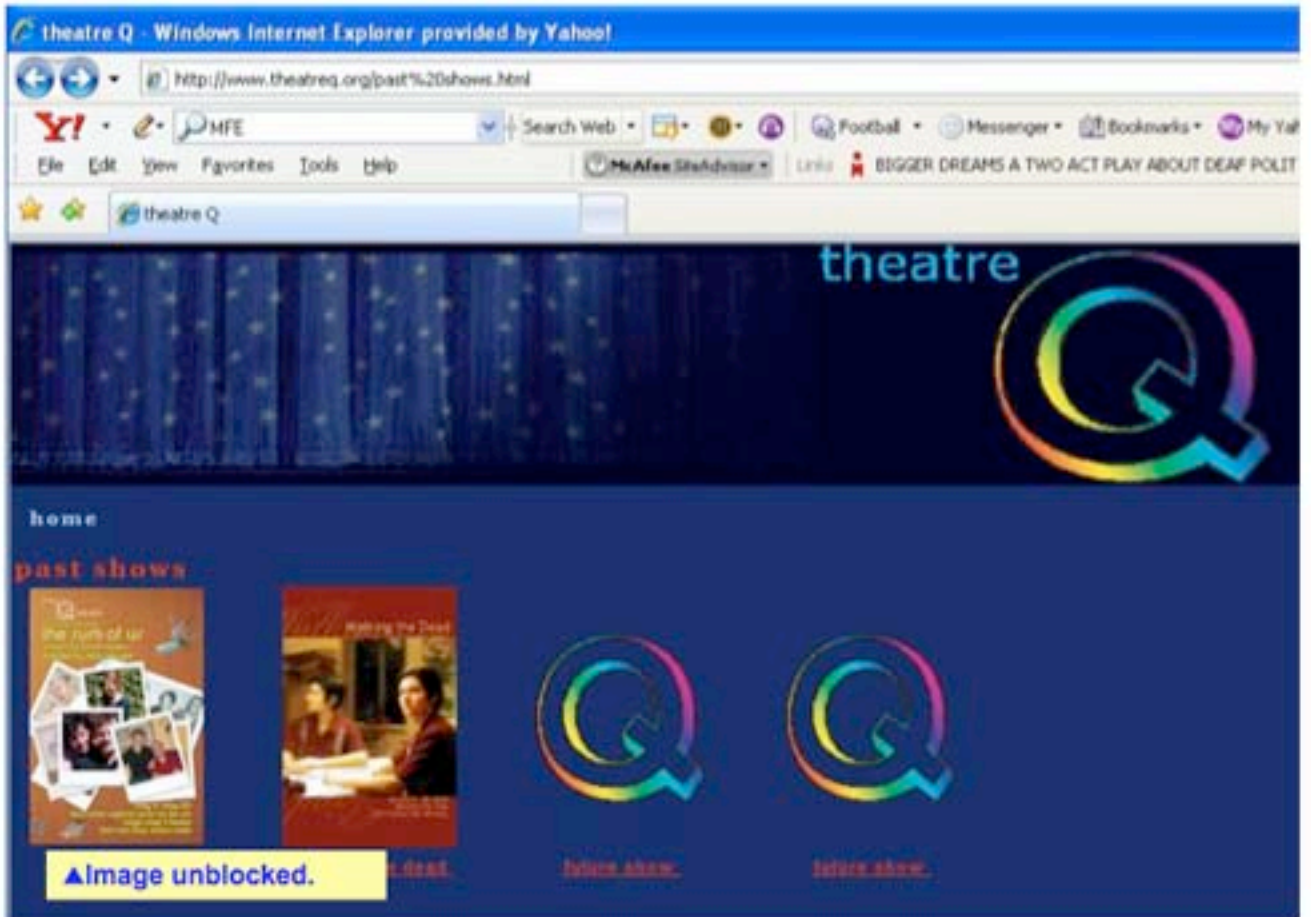


▶ Image analysis prevents some users from viewing potentially inappropriate images on the Internet.


Example of a Blocked Image
